- 13,594 ERSI Responder Safety Learning Network

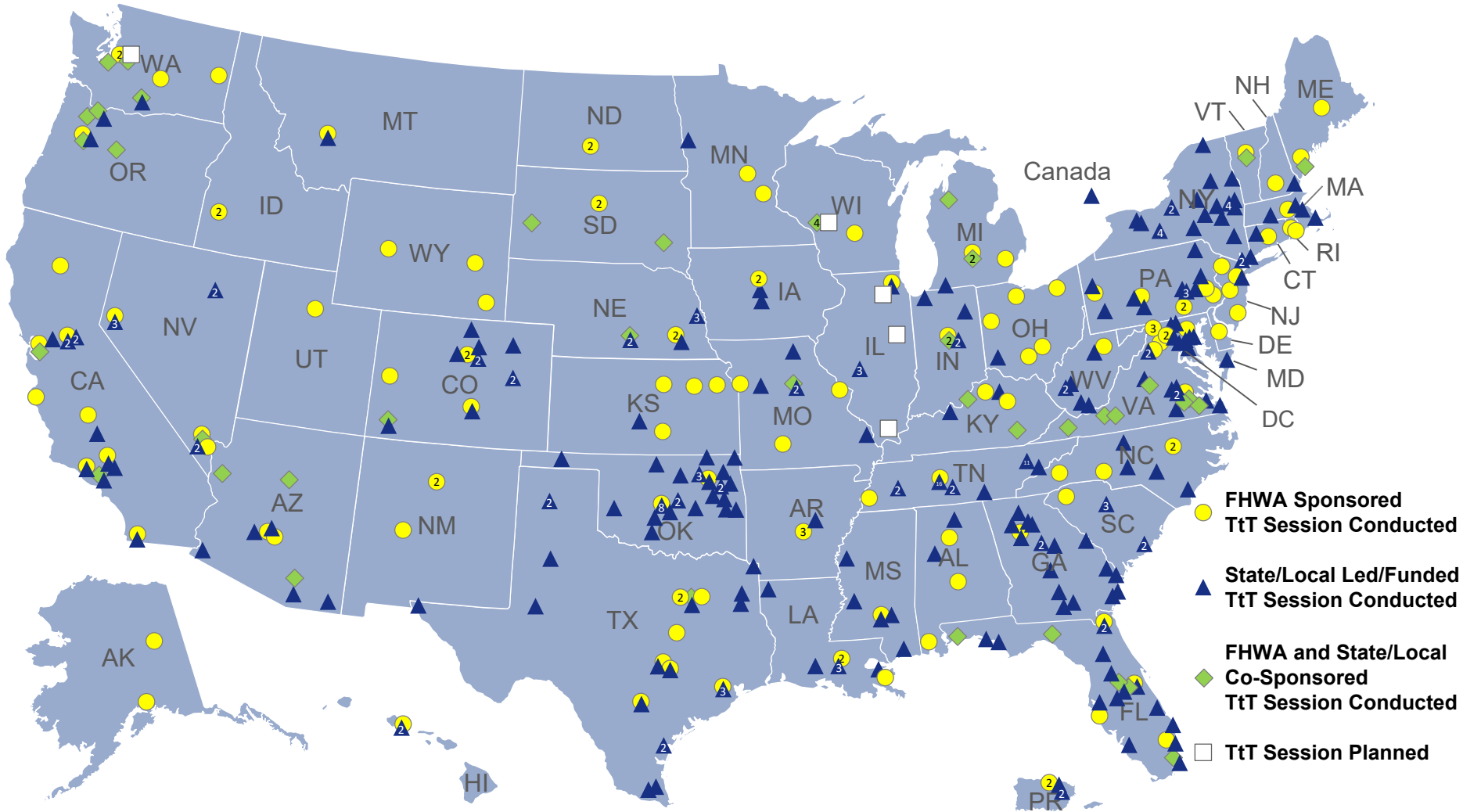

- As of November 10, 2019

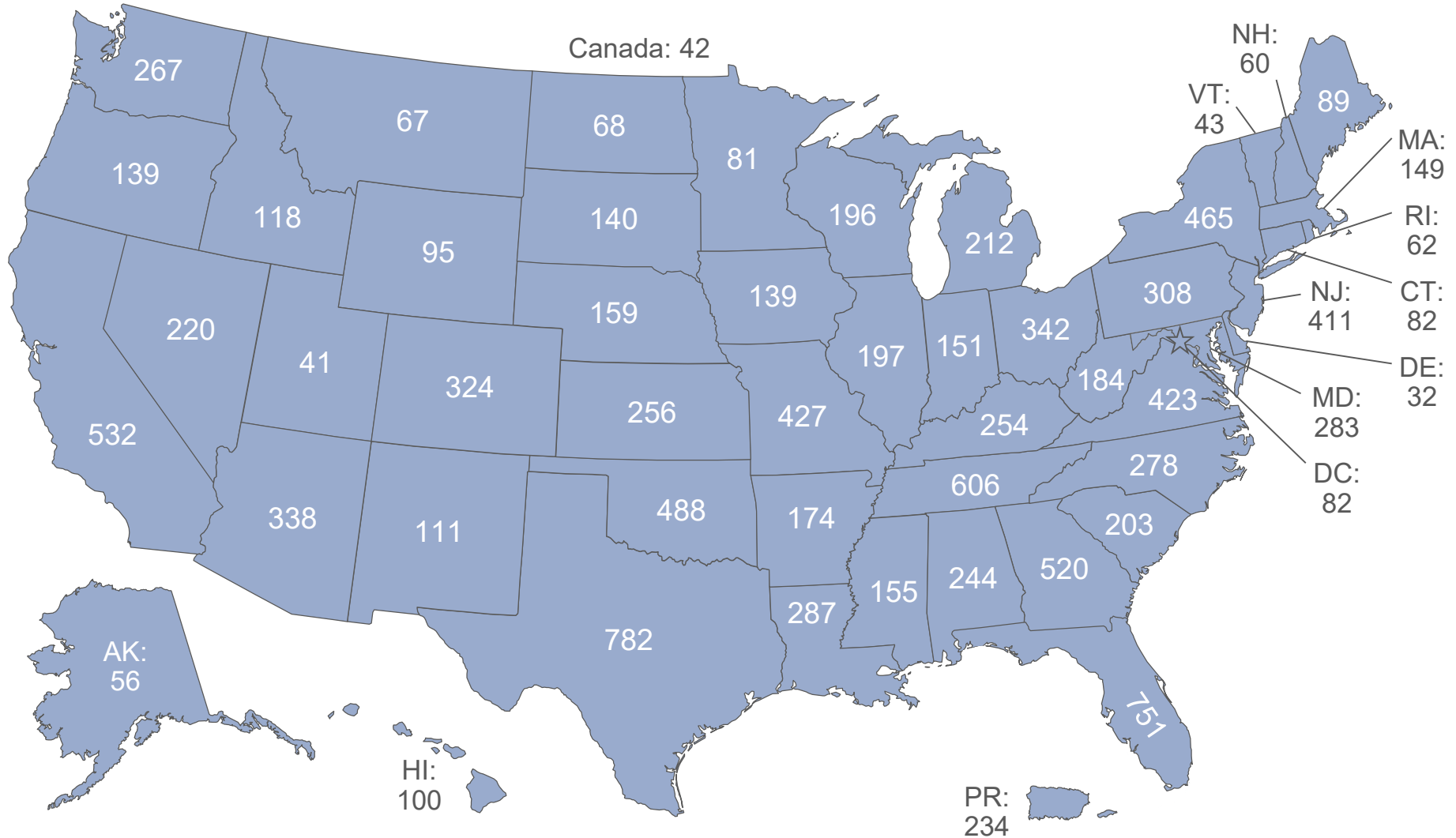

- As of November 10, 2019

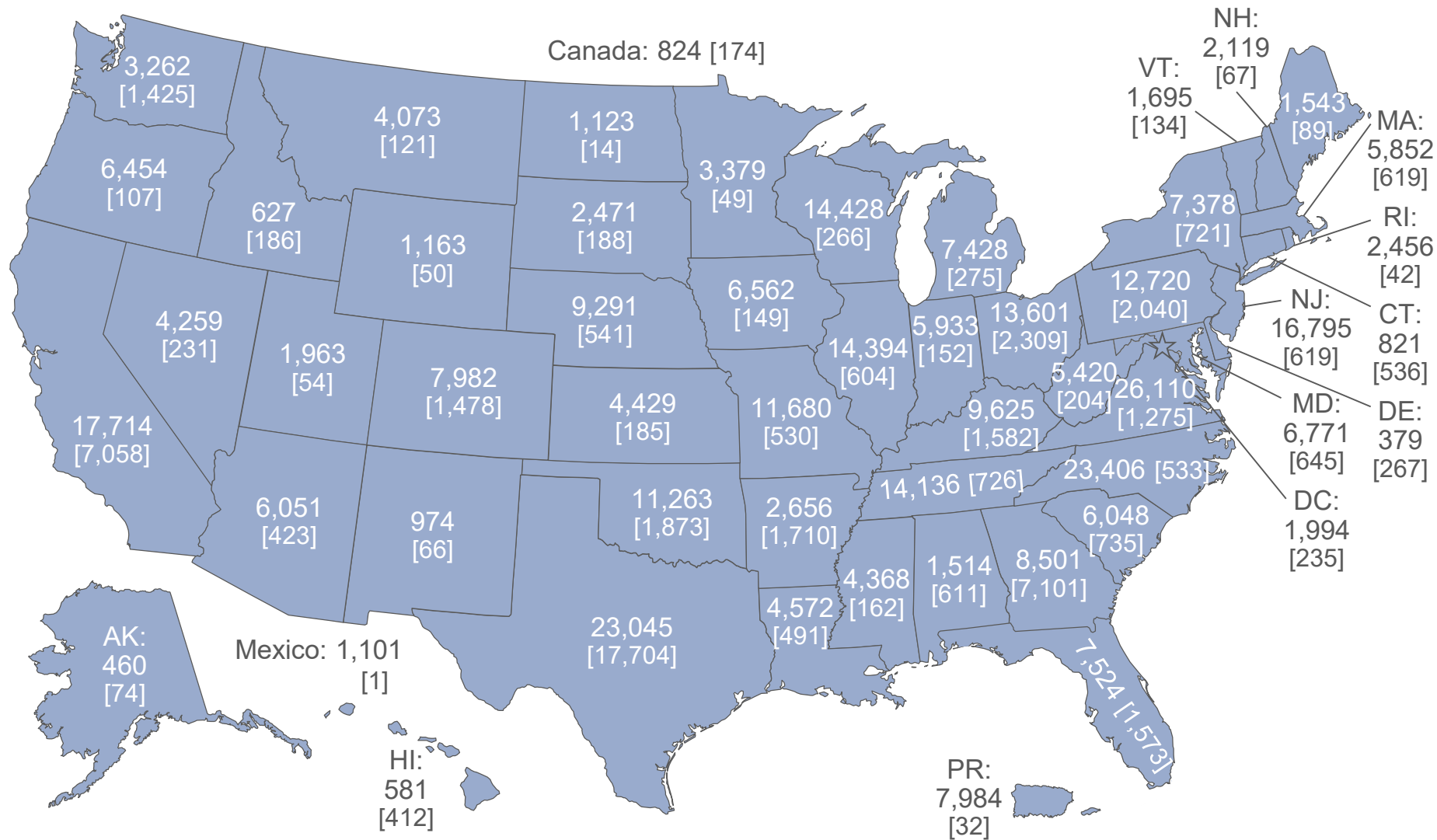

- As of November 10, 2019

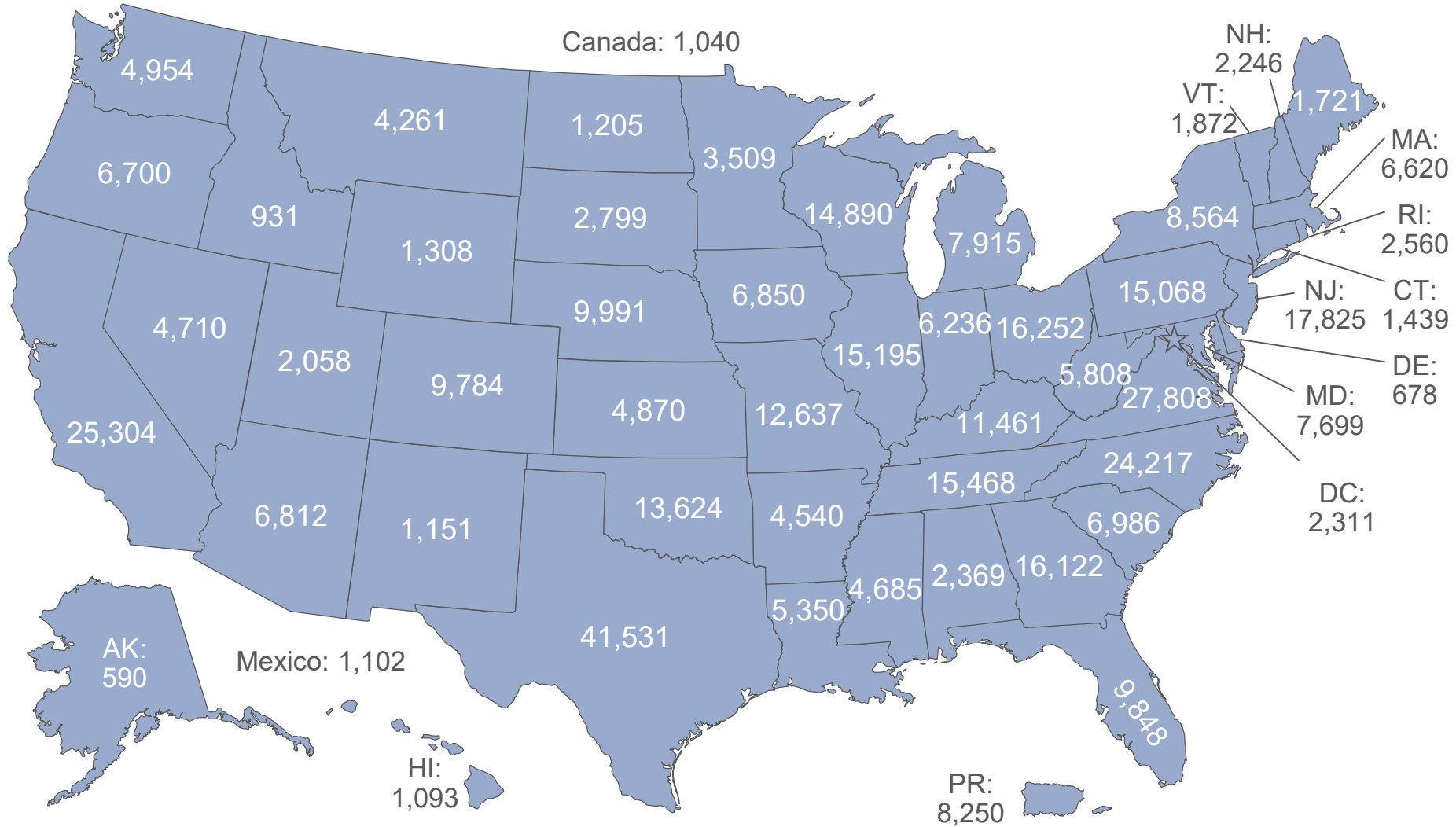

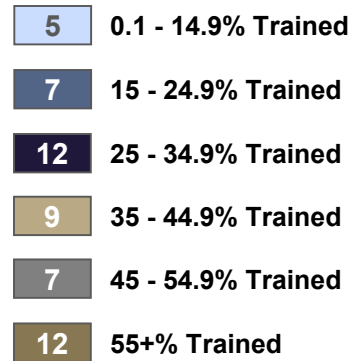
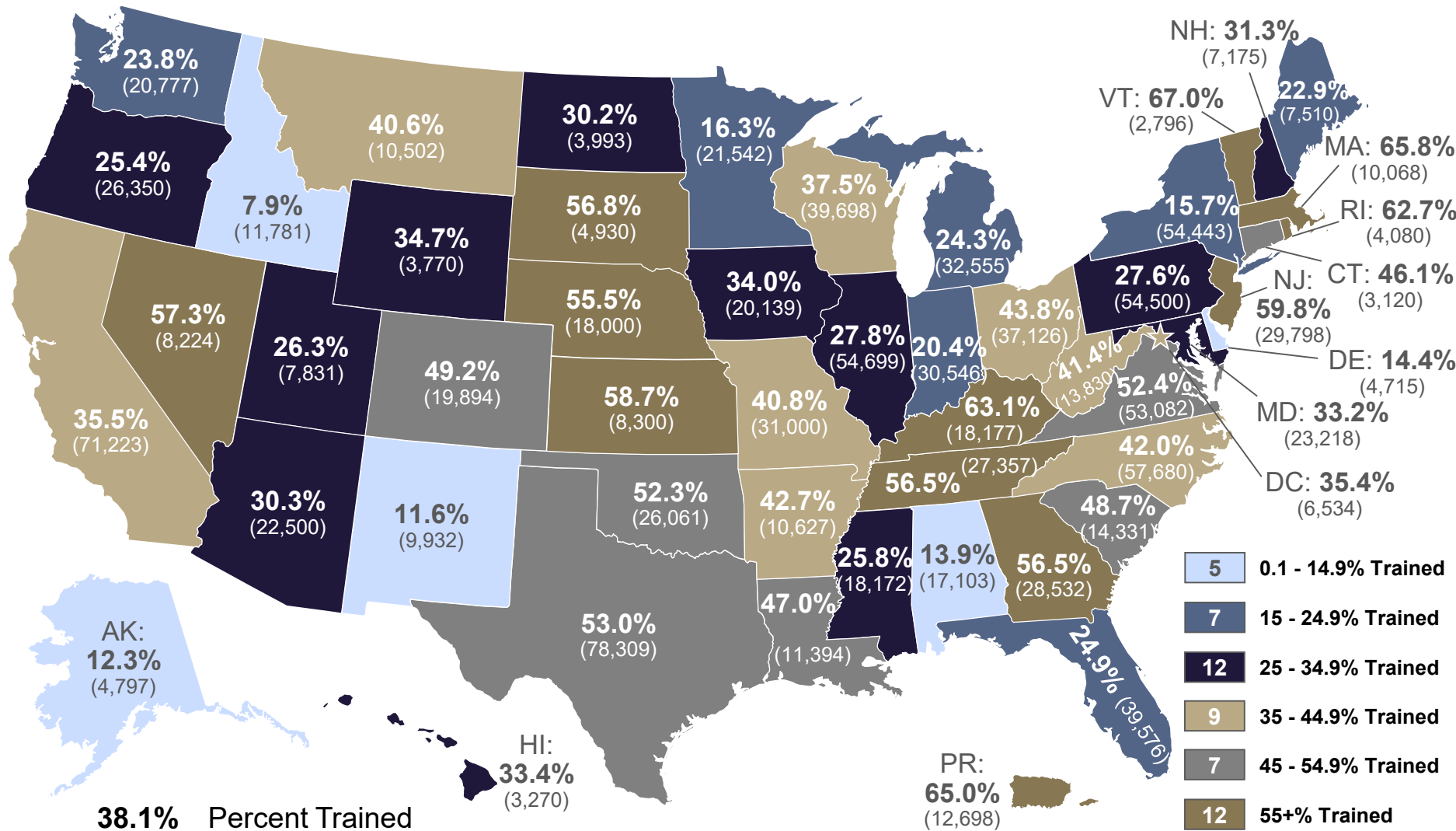

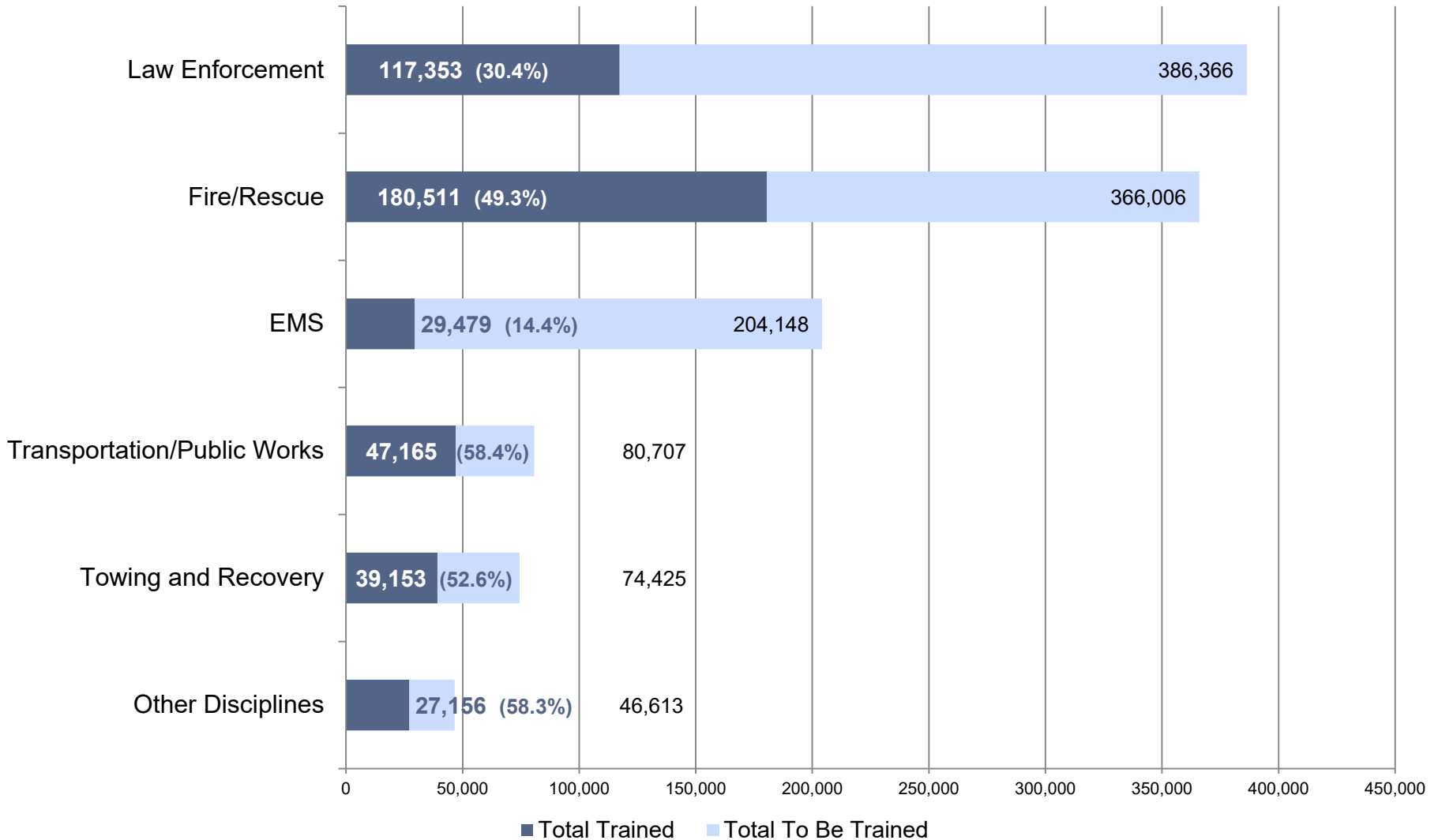
