### November Meeting Recap

Faisal Saleem reviewed highlights from the November meeting, noting that all but one of the actions have been completed. The action to discuss disposition of the initial comments TWG 4 submitted to USDOT will remain open until the new Deployment Guidance is issued.

In November, there was further discussion about outreach efforts by the Connected Vehicle Pooled Fund Study and CVRIA. Comments received and final edits to the summary of Issue 11: V2I Consumer Messaging were shared with the group. Faisal Saleem also shared that the Project Team has advised that this deliverable and the summary of Issue 6: V2I Outreach be shared with the other TWG chairs and cochairs for coalition approval before sending the summaries to USDOT. Faisal Saleem concluded his remarks by explaining that the December meeting had been cancelled due to the continued delay of the V2I Deployment Guidance.

## Issue 14: Federal V2I Policy Statement Discussion

Navin Katta introduced the primary discussion topic for the meeting. He explained that TWG 1: Deployment Initiatives had suggested Issue 14: Federal V2I Policy Statement at the V2I DC working in June. This issue has been described by the Coalition as follows:

The recent NHTSA resolution regarding vehicle-to-vehicle communications has helped the V2V industry. Similar strong encouragement from a federal agency to give infrastructure owners and operators a push to deploy V2I would also help V2I. It is recognized that a rulemaking is likely not possible, but perhaps another strong encouragement from a federal agency (e.g. something similar to the "Every Day Counts" model) could be released. The V2I industry needs a strong message from a federal agency encouraging V2I deployment.

The above referenced policy statements that have been issued by NHTSA to-date include the following:

- Preliminary Statement of Policy Concerning Automated Vehicles
- Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standards: Vehicle-to-Vehicle (V2V) Communications Advance
  Notice of Proposed Rulemaking

Navin Katta further explained that, during the V2I DC Executive Committee meeting in September, Jeff Lindley, USDOT, supported further discussion regarding this issue. In December, Faisal Saleem and Bill Legg, chair of TWG 1, discussed how TWG 1 and TWG 4 could work together to address Issue 14. A meeting of the TWG 1 and TWG 4 core group members was held on January 19 to brainstorm potential topics of interest that could be addressed by such a policy statement. Navin Katta briefly reviewed the topics with the group. Following is a high-level summary of the initial topics of interest that TWG 1 and TWG 4 have brainstormed for consideration in a potential federal V2I policy statement.

- Explanation of why agencies should deploy V2I
- Sample legislative language for agency consideration
- Clarification of aftermarket device role in V2I deployment
- Requirements for deploying, operating and maintaining **V2I equipment**
- Statement on potential liability implications
- Direction on how data should be protected by vendors and agencies
- Explanation of how USDOT is protecting DSRC band for V2I
- Recommendations on use of DSRC band and related channels within the band for V2I

Bob Arnold and Jonathan Walker were asked to comment on the idea of a federal policy statement and the preliminary topics of interest that have been noted so far. Bob Arnold shared that USDOT is working hard to finalize the V2I Deployment Guidance and they hope to release it in the first quarter of 2016. There is a strong need for the guidance in relation to the Connected Vehicle Pilot Deployment Program

and the <u>Smart City Challenge</u>. He added that the new <u>FAST Act legislation</u> will further support Connected Vehicle deployment, particularly Sec. 6004. ADVANCED TRANSPORTATION AND CONGESTION MANAGEMENT TECHNOLOGIES DEPLOYMENT which states, "Not later than 6 months after the date of enactment of this paragraph, the Secretary shall establish an advanced transportation and congestion management technologies deployment initiative to provide grants to eligible entities to develop model deployment sites for large scale installation and operation of advanced transportation technologies to improve safety, efficiency, system performance, and infrastructure return on investment." The legislation further notes that this grant initiative will be funded at \$60,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2016 through 2020. Bob Arnold added that USDOT is developing the solicitation for this initiative now.

Jonathan Walker added that USDOT presented an update on the V2I Deployment Guidance at TRB. The presentation shares the Federal vision and policy statements, as they will appear in the guidance. He offered to share the presentation with Faisal Saleem for distribution to TWG 1 and TWG 4. He also noted that several of the topics of interest brainstormed for a potential Federal V2I policy statement will be addressed by the guidance and corresponding products in some fashion. As such, it was suggested that TWG 1 and TWG 4 wait for release of the guidance and products before issuing anything formal regarding a potential Federal V2I policy statement.

Brian Burkhard noted that there are differing viewpoints on security management and asked if, as the pilots roll out, information will be shared on how they are managing security. Jonathan Walker shared that security and several of the topics of interest noted earlier (e.g. DSRC) are being or will be addressed for the pilot deployments in a webinar series sponsored by the Connected Vehicle Pilot Deployment Program. Many of the webinars are open to the public at large and most are also recorded/available on the pilot program website under Technical Assistance Events.

Bob Taylor asked if the V2I Deployment Guidance will address why agencies should deploy V2I. Jonathan Walker replied that the guidance focuses more on funding eligibility and approaches for deployment. He added that the guidance was not intended to convince agencies to deploy V2I. Rather, the supporting products associated with the guidance will likely better address agency questions about why to deploy V2I. He also noted that some of the recent and upcoming outreach tools developed by Karen Timpone's group may further support agency questions about why to deploy V2I.

## Next Steps and Meeting

Faisal Saleem asked TWG 4 members to further consider what additional topics of interest they may want to see addressed in a Federal V2I policy statement. He added that this issue will also be discussed by TWG 1 and additional information will be shared during the February TWG 4 meeting. The February and March meeting dates were shared with the group, along with a note that a full V2I DC workshop is being planned for the week of April 18. A general announcement regarding the spring workshop is expected to be released soon.
